2022 was our twelfth successful vear in operation. Joe and I never dreamed in a million years that our daughter's legacy would blossom into this beautiful goodness. We have helped over 600 families in the Inland Northwest and 35 families have found solace in Anna's Homes since 2018. In addition to helping every diagnosed family, we are overjoyed to share that we are in the planning process of Phase 2 of Anna's Homes. Phase 2 will offer

four units to host childhood cancer families traveling to Spokane's Sacred Heart Children's Hospital for their child's intensive cancer treatments. Each unit will have 2 bedrooms, 1-2 bathrooms, a full kitchen, living space, laundry, and so much more. We are hopeful to offer housing to families in our Phase 2 units by Spring 2024. Anna's Homes Phase 2 will be built because of amazing donors like you!

When a child is diagnosed, the family is diagnosed.

Little Ivy was diagnosed with leukemia just weeks after her 3rd birthday. Ivy's parents were told her treatment would last 2-3 years including a 4-6 week

stay in Spokane (90 minutes from home) for an intensive phase of treatment. We were thrilled to be able to have Ivy, her mom and five siblings stay at Anna's Homes during this phase while their dad worked at home, visiting Spokane as often as possible. The family was able to continue homeschooling at Anna's Homes and enjoy being together despite the disruption of cancer treatment. They stayed at Anna's Homes for 55 nights, at no cost to them. After countless treatments, procedures, hair loss and regrowth, hospital visits, setbacks, and successes, we are pleased to share that Ivy is in remission and her treatment completion date is planned for Summer 2023! Over the last two years, you have supported Ivy and her family with utility payments, mortgage support, car payments, hospital meal cards, and more. Thank you!

From the Treasurer

It is a great pleasure to report that during 2022, the Anna Schindler Foundation once again achieved a year of record results. Our supporters helped us continue to achieve our mission of directly supporting pediatric oncology families through financial assistance as well as housing via Anna's Homes and allowed us to significantly build our resources for construction of Phase 2 of Anna's Homes, which will provide four additional units to out-of-town families needing housing nearby to Sacred



Heart Children's Hospital. Occupancy continues to average over 90%.

During 2022, total revenues and donations from all sources grew to over \$637K, up over 40% from the prior year. This was the result of continued growth in our donor base as well as an incredible show of support for our only major fundraiser - the annual golf tournament. Funds used for the direct benefit of childhood cancer families during the year totaled to a record \$252K - up significantly from the \$163K disbursed in 2021.

ASF entered 2022 with no debt and a strong cash position and ended the year with over \$390K in cash reserves, the majority of which is planned to be used for construction of Phase 2 of Anna's Homes. We have had some delays in the planning/approval of Phase 2, which will hopefully be ironed out by mid-2023 and allow us to proceed with construction of the four new units.

We continue to operate with a modest paid staff and over 30 volunteers which help coordinate our events and donor relations.
